The entire lot, or representative samples of each lot, will be returned to the shipper.

Gentlemen:

In reply to your letter of January 31, we wish to say that since we installed one of your Separators at our factory last November, we have completed the cleaning of our seed peas. At the time we purchased your machine we had half our stock hand-picked, but upon running the other half over the Separator, we did likewise with all the hand-picked seed with very gratifying results. We hand-picked one lot of Alaskas at a cost of \$3.25 per bushel and later ran the same lot over your Separator, which took out 25% of the already hand-picked seed. The one-fourth of the seed which was taken out was examined very carefully, but no good seed was found. The germination tests were taken of the good seed and the lot which was separated out. The first test showed a 94% germination and the second a 2% germination. Practically all that the machine removed were weeviled, and the remaining stock showed no trace of this fault.

We have been very much pleased with the performance of your Separator.

Please send to us by parcel post a new top cloth for your Grader and Cleaner that we purchased from you some years ago. The cloth on our machine is worn out and it is necessary for us to put on a new cloth. Therefore, we wish you would send us as soon as possible a piece of sufficient size to cover our machine.

We have been using the machine right along every day that the mill runs, and we feel that we cannot get along without your machine in the grading of screenings. And in this we use it for two purposes. First we pull heavy on all our cleaning machines and scourers and do not worry if it carries a few good wheat berries with the screenings. This stream of screenings then goes over your machine, we reclaim all the good wheat for milling purposes, and then the cracked kernels and light grains we take off for chick wheat. The balance of the residue is ground for feed.

Hoping that you will be able to ship us the cloth at an early date.

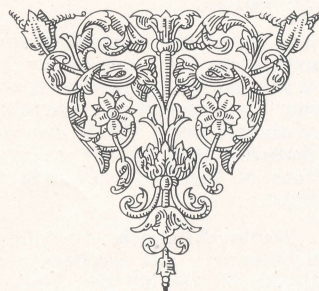

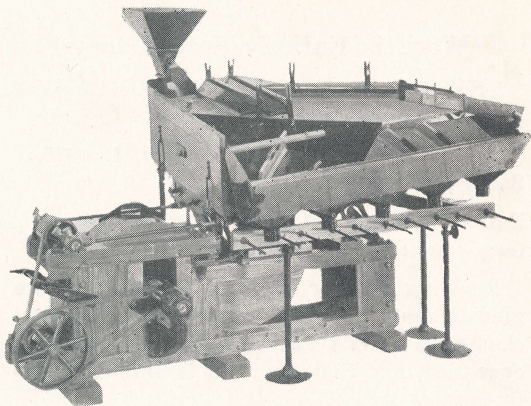
